Child File Review No 37.95.140(1)-(4) (1) Before a child under the age of five may attend a Montana day care facility, that facility must be provided with the documentation required by (4) that the child has been immunized as required for the child's age group against measles, rubella, mumps, poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough), tetanus, and Haemophilus influenza type B, unless the child qualifies for conditional attendance in accordance with (9):(2) If the child is at least 12 months old but not less than 60 months of age and has not received any Hib vaccine, the child must receive a dose prior to entry. (3) DT vaccine administered to a child less than 7 years of age is acceptable for purposes of this rule only if accompanied by a medical exemption meeting the requirements of ARM 16.28.707 that exempts the child from pertussis vaccination. (4) Before a child between the ages of five and 12 may attend a day care facility providing care to school aged children, that facility must be provided with documentation required by (5) that the child has been immunized as required for the child's age group against measles, rubella, mumps, poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough), tetanus, and Haemophiles influenza type B, unless the child qualifies for conditional attendance in accordance with (9).   - (b) directions for calling parents or someone else designated as responsible for the child when a child is sick or injured.
